Calgary Forklift Certification Schools - Forklift Certification is mandatory within North America. Thus, forklift training programs are necessary both for businesses and for people looking for jobs in industries as forklift operators. Forklift training focuses on safety and health concerns involved in forklift use. Safety concerns affect both the forklift driver and workers and other individuals who are in close proximity to the forklift. Businesses may be subject to penalties if they are caught with drivers who are not certified during a check up. There are several compelling reasons why companies have to comply with forklift standards.

Before the employee or trainee is certified to operate a forklift, nearly all state, provincial and federal rules would require the employee go through an evaluation of the skills essential for forklift safety. There are several forklift certification schools offering courses for workers and there are likewise schools that provide on line forklift training. Nonetheless, employers should be aware that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Proper forklift training should include some fields of study, including theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not require employers to have an outside organization to certify forklift drivers.

The suggested curriculum for a quality forklift certification service involves both an onsite component and classroom training. Classroom training usually features informative sessions with videos, power point presentations, models and discussions. Students normally must write a test to check for subject matter comprehension. Certificates of completion are given upon successfully completing the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation requires the trainee to know the job site hazards, pre-operational machine check, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

The following subject areas will normally be covered in the training: Controls & Instrumentations; Understanding regulations and legislations; Steering and Maneuvering; Engine Operation and Maintenance; Fork and Attachment Restrictions, Visibility; Stability, Rated Capacities, Inspection & Maintenance; Load Manipulation; Refueling; Pedestrians, and Dangerous Places & Rough Terrain Operation. There are even training courses available for employees who are transitioning to new job positions.
